In a church our size and with so many of our members reaching their 80's and 90's, funerals are a very sad "fact of life" in the church family. In the past 12 months we have said farewell to ten members and each of the services was difficult. In fact, my first funeral service as Pastor here was on February 15, 2003 for Curtis Maynard and the next scheduled service I have will be August 6 for Jean Calhoun. That will mark the 220th Funeral service of my 19 + years here as your pastor.

The passing of each of these individuals leaves a hole in the fabric of our church tapestry. There is so much I could say (and have said) about each of them but I feel it important to mention them in this article. Perhaps it is the Pandemic that serves as somewhat of a line of demarcation over the past few years of our church history. Although none of our departed loved ones were due to the Covid virus, it just seems like our church has been hit hard by the passing of all of these members, and especially those in the past couple of years.

Every church loves receiving new members, and since the pandemic hit, we have been blessed with about 16 new members to our church family. Some have come in due to conversion and believers baptism. Some have come in as transfers by letter from other churches, A few by statement of faith and previous baptism, because circumstances would not allow us to receive a letter. Our newest members range in age from 6 years old, to those in their 8th decade of life. We are excited to receive each of them into our church family. As happy as we are to welcome new members, it is still hard to say farewell to the ones who have left us during this time.

Most all of the members we have lost to death were faithful to the church, and served our congregation well in so many ways over the years. We have lost Sunday School teachers, Children's workers, Deacons, various volunteers, several ministry leaders, and folks who have served in various roles over the years. Most of them were individuals who have been members here for a number of years and many practiced the graces of prayer, attending regularly, and giving of their resources to the ministry of the church.

We have "stood on their shoulders" and on the shoulders of other faithful members throughout the 107 year history of this church. We who remain MUST step up and fill their shoes for our church to continue to be the ministry point it needs to be in the Westmoreland Community.

In honor of those who have gone before us, let us take to heart the words of a great Christian song, "Find us Faithful".

Christians Killed By Islamic Extremists In The Congo


Beni Territory, Democratic Republic of the Congo - More than 110 Christians were killed June 21 when Islamist extremists ambushed three vehicles just days after another similar deadly attack.

The extremist group, Allied Democratic Forces, carried out the rampage June 21 on Beni-Kasindi Road in the embattled Beni territory of the Democratic Republic of the Congo. The rights group International Christian Concern said militant forces reportedly blocked the road and shot all occupants of the vehicles before setting them ablaze. Five people were killed June 17 in a similar attack on Beni-Butembo Road.

One source said there is "no single day that they do not kill people". The villages are unsafe. The roads are unsafe. We only live by God's mercy."

The day before the June 21 ambush, heads of state of the East African Community met in Nairobi, Kenya, about security concerns.

The **Democratic Republic of** the Congo formerly and also colloquially Zaire, is a country in Central Africa. The DRC is located in sub-Saharan Africa. With a population of around 108 million, the Democratic Republic of the Congo is the most populous officially Francophone country in the world. The capital and largest city is Kinshasa, which is also the world's most populous Francophone city and largest city in Africa. It is the third largest African city in metropolitan area after Lagos and Cairo.





Praise To The Lord The Almighty

Joachim Neander (1650 - 5/31/1680)

As a student in Bremen, Germany, Joachim Neander lived a Godless life. Though both his father and grandfather were Lutheran Ministers, Joachim wasted his life in immorality. Then, when Neander was twenty, a preacher named Under-Eyke came to Bremen to preach. Neander went to the meeting intending to ridicule the preacher, but instead, he was converted to Christ.





Despite the tensions, he wrote many hymns of praise. He often wandered through the valleys and hills near Dusseldorf, communing with his Lord. After losing his position at the school, he lived for a time in a cave and continued to write hymns. He died very young, at the age of thirty, but he left behind a legacy of praise to God.

- 1 Praise to the Lord, the Almighty, the King of creation! O my soul, praise him, for he is your health and salvation!
 - Come, all who hear; now to his temple draw near, join me in glad adoration.
- 2 Praise to the Lord, above all things so wondrously reigning;
 - sheltering you under his wings, and so gently sustaining!

- 3 Praise to the Lord, who will prosper your work and defend you;
- surely his goodness and mercy shall daily attend you.
