Indian Pastor Murdered After Being Accused of Being An Informant

Chhattisgarh State, India - A Pastor accursed of being a police informant was murdered in front of his family on March17. Yalam Shankar was killed outside his home in Angampalli village in India's Chhattisgarh State.

The six masked assailants slit his throat and shot and stabbed him in the chest. Later they kicked him to make sure he was dead

According to a note left on his body, the People's Liberation Guerrilla Army, which is part of the Communist Party of India was responsible for his murder.

In January, a notice directed to Yalam and 21 other Christians warned them to "Leave pastorship of the Christian faith" and to return to worshiping tribal gods, according to the Morning Star News.

Iranian-Armenian Pastor Sentenced To 10 Years In Prison For House Church

Tehran, Iran - An Iranian-Armenian pastor has been sentenced to 110 years in prison, followed by 10 years of "deprivation of social rights," for running a Christian House Church in Tehran, Iran.

The Judgment against Anooshavan Avedian is for "establishing and leading an Illegal group," the relief organization Barnabas Fund reported.

Abbas Soori and Maryam Mohammadi, two members of the church were sentenced to 10 years of social deprivation" for being part of the "illegal group." Their penalty also includes a two year exile from Tehran, a fine of 50 million tomans (\$1,700) and a two year ban on joining any social groups and traveling outside the country. The three were arrested in a house church raid in August 2020.

As an Armenian Christian, Anooshavan could worship in his own language.. However, it is illegal for him to conduct services in Farsi, the national language of Iran.

In Anzali, Iran, Ministry of Intelligence agents in April raided the home of Rahmat Rostamipour, a Christian convert from Islam, The Barnabas Fund reported. Although Rostamipour was not charged with anything, he was put into detention in a location unknown to his family.



Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee

Henry Van Dyke (1852 - 1933)

One of my favorite all time hymns was written by Henry Van Dyke who lived from 1852 till 1933. It seems that I hear it most often at Christmas time, but it is a great hymn year round.

Van Dyke was serving as a guest preacher at Williams College in the Berkshire Mountains of Massachusetts. He was so moved by the beauty of God's creation that he wrote this hymn of joy. The next morning, he handed the poem to the college president. "Here is a hymn for you" he said. "Your mountains were my inspiration. It must be sung to the music of Beethoven's "Hymn to Joy." And so it has ever since.

Van Dyke was a Presbyterian minister; the author of many books, including the best selling "The Other Wise Man". He was a professor of literature at Princeton University, a Navy Chaplain during World War I; and ambassador to Holland and Luxembourg under President Woodrow Wilson.

When he published this hymn in 1911, he noted that it was to be sung by people who "are not afraid that any truth of science will destroy their religion or that any revolution on earth will overthrow the kingdom of heaven." With such confidence the Christian has much to rejoice about.

- 1 Joyful, joyful, we adore You, God of glory, Lord of love; Hearts unfold like flow'rs before You, Op'ning to the sun above. Melt the clouds of sin and sadness; Drive the dark of doubt away; Giver of immortal gladness, Fill us with the light of day!
- 2 All Your works with joy surround You, Earth and heav'n reflect Your rays, Stars and angels sing around You, Center of unbroken praise; Field and forest, vale and mountain, Flow'ry meadow, flashing sea, Chanting bird and flowing fountain Praising You eternally!

- 3 Always giving and forgiving,
 Ever blessing, ever blest,
 Well-spring of the joy of living,
 Ocean-depth of happy rest!
 Loving Father, Christ our Brother,
 Let Your light upon us shine;
 Teach us how to love each other,
 Lift us to the joy divine.
- 4 Mortals, join the mighty chorus, Which the morning stars began; God's own love is reigning o'er us, Joining people hand in hand. Ever singing, march we onward, Victors in the midst of strife; Joyful music leads us sunward In the triumph song of life.

Philippians 4:4-7 (ESV) Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.
